

THE ECONOMICS OF LOCAL

AMAZON AND EMPTY STOREFRONTS

In 2014, Amazon sold \$44.1 billion worth of retail goods nationwide while avoiding \$625 million in state and local sales taxes, according to a study by The American Booksellers Association and Civic Economics.

Even counting all the jobs in Amazon distribution centers, Amazon sales produced a net national loss of 135,973 retail jobs, and a total of more than \$1 billion in revenue was lost to state and local governments.



JOBS PER \$10 MILLION IN SALES IN THE UNITED STATES:






